Alice T. Magill

Appointed as City Court Judge of Santa Paula In November, 1938

Judge Alice T. Magill

elected as Justice Court Judge in Santa Paula at the age of 72

Judge Alice T. Magill

Becomes a Municipal Court judge in Santa Paula on 10/14/65 when the county court system was modified

Judge Alice T. Magill

Appointed to the Municipal Court on Jan. 1, 1966

Judge Alice T. Magill

Retires on 12/31/68

Judge Alice T. Magill, Ret.

Passes away on 12/22/1975

Judge Melinda Johnson

Appointed to Municipal Court by Governor Edmund Gerald Brown Jr. on 2/8/1982, and begins assignment on 2/16/1982





Judge Barbara Lane

Appointed by Governor George Deukmejian to Municipal Court on July 2,1986
