## **VENTURA SUPERIOR COURT SELECTS NEW COMMISSIONER**

The judges of the Ventura Superior Court have announced the selection of Anthony J. Sabo as the court's newest commissioner. He fills the vacancy created by the recent appointment of Ferdinand "Dino" Inumerable to a judgeship. Commissioner Sabo will assume his new duties on Monday, May 12, 2014.

Commissioner Sabo has been a Senior Deputy District Attorney with the Ventura County District Attorney's Office since 2008. Most recently he was assigned to the major crimes gang unit. Prior to that, he was a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney in both Ohio and Dearborn Counties, Indiana, from 1997 to 2008, prosecuting misdemeanor and felony cases. The last five years he was also the Prosecuting Attorney's representative to the drug court program.

From 1995 to 2008, he simultaneously was the sole practitioner of his own law office. His primary areas of concentration included family law, bankruptcy, estate planning and real estate law. During that period, he was also an attorney to the County Planning Commission, County Board of Zoning Appeals, and County and City Parks and Recreation Board for eight years; and an attorney for the City of Rising Sun, Indiana, for four years.

Commissioner Sabo is a graduate of the University of Indiana and earned his law degree from the University of North Dakota School of Law.

Superior Court Commissioners hear matters including, but not limited to, Family Law, Juvenile Delinquency and Dependency, Child Support Services, Domestic Violence, Civil Harassment, Traffic, Criminal and Small Claims. They are required to have been admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of California for at least ten years and serve at the pleasure of a majority of the court judges.
